- Build capacity in the health care system to accelerate safety improvements
- Improve communication and engagement between clinicians and patients
- Make the safe thing the easy thing to do

AHRQ's SOPS Program



- Initiated and funded by AHRQ since 2001
- Develops survey measures that are validated and use best methods for development and testing
- Advances the understanding, measurement, and improvement of patient safety culture within healthcare settings
- Conducts research to further...
 - the measurement and understanding of patient safety culture
 - the collection of data and informative reporting of patient safety culture data
 - patient safety improvement involving SOPS

Background to Revising HSOPS 1.0



- AHRQ program is committed to periodic reviews of surveys to ensure their relevance
- Received feedback from users:
 - Content: staff positions/work areas; orientation to just culture;
 - Structure: NA/DK; negatively worded and complex items
- Used the standard SOPS methodology to develop new items and test them
- Surprising results in 2017 pilot test required redesign and retesting in 2019
